BSAECO Magna Cum Laude is CEM Class 2017 Valedictorian

This year, the College has 220 candidates for graduation coming from its 3 degree programs, namely: the Bachelor of Science in Agribusiness Management (71), the Bachelor of Science in Agricultural Economics (71), and the Bachelor of Science in Economics (78). Twenty-five are graduating with honors; 22 *cum laude* and 3 *magna cum laude*. For this graduating class, the valedictorian is Mr. Reymond Denver Q. Buenaseda, a BS Agricultural Economics graduate.

Mr. Buenaseda, also known as Moi by his relatives and as Den by his college friends, was born in Calamba City, Laguna on July 9, 1997. He attended preschool at the age of three and a half and had spent his elementary and secondary education at Canossa Academy Calamba. He is dubbed as a persistent and diligent student who always devotes his time in the library. In UP, he took a degree in Agricultural Economics and finished with flying colors - as magna cum laude and a college valedictorian. But before this success, he had to overcome numerous problems that he called turning points in his life.

At the young age of two, his father died due to heart attack. Given this circumstance, his mother had to work doubly hard in order to send him and his siblings in a private school. It was in his fourth grade when he started to realize the value of education because his mother had to borrow from informal lenders to finance their studies. From that point on, he engaged himself to different academic and extra-curricular activities. He excelled in social sciences particularly in his economics subject. This made him chose economics as his desired degree in UP. However, he did not pass the UPCAT. He was disheartened at first, but chose to fight in order to fulfil his dream. He remained focused and waitlisted for the degree in Agricultural Economics.

After being admitted, he made sure that every effort counted. He lived by the quote from Rommel Bulalacao (Professor at the Institute of Computer Science, UPLB): *Every time you feel like quitting on a subject, skipping a class, or not doing a class requirement: may you remember how privileged you were to get that one precious slot that could have belonged to someone else; someone who might have deserved it more.* Den firmly believed that there are other students who deserve to study in a premier university such as UP but were not able to do so because of financial barriers. That is why he had to prove that being admitted to UP was not a fluke. He went the extra mile, so to speak. In order to get good grades, he had to review a week before the exam date and had to participate actively in class. Being a commuter for four years in college, he had to wake up two hours before his first class. In his early years in college, he fondly recalls that he reads the handouts while on board. These extra efforts made him a consistent toponotcher in class. In UP, *ningas kugon* must be avoided. According to him, consistency is a primary ingredient to success. But beyond academic excellence, Den put premium on preserving his integrity. As future leaders of the country, every Isko and Iska must uphold honor and excellence.

In the end, he concluded that there are no secrets and shortcuts to success. Being successful is a matter of pursuing your dreams and making do with the limited resources you have.

management and technical and customer advisory support. As Vice President, he is responsible for the **company's overall strategy formulation and execution** to ensure brand leadership and growth in the farm and food meat business.

He had expanded and developed the sales and meat **operations organization to improve the company's** services and increased customer satisfaction through the creation of teams focused on handling modern trade and key accounts, management of categories within the meat and food business, including retail and the management of slaughter and meat cutting and processing operations. A feather to his cap is in achieving the Board approval to start a multi-million Modern Pig Slaughter and Meat Cutting and Cold Storage facility to be completed and operational by the 1st half of 2018.

Hendel started as a junior researcher in 1993 at the Foundation for Resource Linkage and Development (FRLD) as part of a research team working on the production and marketing of selected vegetables in the Philippines. Then in 1994 he moved to Monterey Foods and Corporation as Area Coordinator for swine breeding operations where he co-managed with the farm manager a 600-sow level contract breeder farm in Tanay, Rizal.

He led the farm in exceeding its farm efficiency targets, therefore, exceeding output and gaining better profits for the company and the contract breeder. He worked with Monterey Foods Corporation for four years before transferring to Fil-am Foods Inc now Pilmico as Territory Business Manager. From there he inched his way up to become the Vice President for Sales.

His focus is on start-up companies, projects and products. His notable projects and programs focused on supporting the profitability and growth of the backyard and medium scale swine farmers in the Philippines, being the second largest agricultural industry after rice. This interest has its roots in the degrees he had completed.

Hendel attended high school at UP Baguio High School and elementary education at the Special Education (SPED) School, also in Baguio. Having earned his undergraduate degree in Agricultural Economics degree at the Department of Agricultural and Applied Economics major in Agricultural Marketing and Prices in 1993 at the foothills of Mount Makiling, his heart is still with the small and medium scale farmers. From there he took up and finished his Masters in Entrepreneurship degree at the Asian Institute of Management in 2003.

He is married to Fe Cabral, also a BS Agricultural Economics graduate and a National Officer of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) under the Governance portfolio. They have two children, Geo, who graduated from the Ateneo De Manila University last May 2017 with a course in Communications Technology Management and Bea who is currently a sophomore at the University of the Philippines Diliman taking up BS Psychology. Both his parents, Mr. Herminio Cabral and Mrs. Lea Cabral graduated also from UP Los Baños. *MESPladozo*
